Construction slows, optimism remains

The U.S. construction industry added 19,000 jobs in September, and gained a total of 38,000 jobs over September 2024, according to new government data released Nov. 20.

The Associated General Contractors said the 0.5 percent year-over-year rise in industry employment was less than the 0.8 percent growth rate in total U.S. nonfarm payroll employment. However, AGC officials noted that firms continue to add employees to keep pace with demand for public sector projects and data centers, even as other segments of the industry are experiencing slowing demand.

U.S. construction employment in September totaled 8,305,000, seasonally adjusted, an increase of 19,000 from August.

Nonresidential construction firms added 16,300 jobs in September, marking continued growth across much of the sector. Meanwhile, residential construction employment rose by 3,100 jobs.

The increase in construction employment in September ended a streak of three consecutive monthly declines. Overall, the industry has added just 2,000 jobs since March.

As we've noted, a wide swath of federal economic and employment statistics are late in being compiled and announced because of the government shutdown.

The construction unemployment rate increased to 3.8 percent in September. Unemployment across all industries increased from 4.3 percent in August to 4.4 percent in September.

"Despite some significant economic uncertainties, construction firms remain optimistic enough to continue adding to their payrolls," said Jeffrey Shoaf, the AGC's chief executive officer. "The best way to sustain that momentum is by providing clarity about tariff levels, stabilizing materials prices and developing a more robust workforce.'

Michigan ranked No. 15 in Hardhat pay

Michigan's construction workers ranked No. 15 among the states in annual wages earned in 2025, with paychecks averaging \$64,055 per year.

That information comes from Construction Coverage, which compiles information on the industry based on federal government statistics. Leading the pack in annual wages are Hardhats in Illinois (\$79,328); followed by Hawaii (\$73,060) and Alaska (\$72,841).


Five right-to-work states are ahead of Michigan when it comes to building trades worker pay. Conversely, 13 of the 15 states on the bottom of the pay list are right-to-work

On average, building trades workers in Florida are the lowest paid in the nation (\$46,843) followed by Texas (\$49,817) and Georgia (\$50,683).

Appeal seems likely to further allow **Trump's union-busting**

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The union-buster-in-chief's efforts to cancel union coverage for about 1 million federal employees isn't a mere talking point – President Trump is showing he's in it for the legal long haul.

In March and August, Trump issued executive orders abolishing collective bargaining rights for workers across some 24 federal agencies under the guise that their union membership somehow threatens national security. On Oct. 28, a federal judge issued an injunction pausing the nullification of those union rights. Earlier this month, the Trump Administration took the case up a notch, appealing that pro-union verdict to a Washington, D.C. federal appeals court.

National Association of Government Employees President David Holway said the federal judge's Oct. 28 ruling "brings relief to thousands of federal workers and their families who have spent weeks fearing for their jobs. While this is not the final outcome, it gives workers and their families peace of mind and shows that the courts recognize the seriousness of what they are facing."

In the appeals court, or perhaps the Supreme Court, the outlook for federal workers to retain their union representation seems dim. In September, the D.C. appeals court similarly upheld Trump's union busting in a separate case, citing the president's broad national security powers.

One quarter of U.S. trades workers are foreign-born but not so much in Mich.

With all the hubbub surrounding immigration and its effect on the U.S. workplace, comes the delivery of specific new research on the impact of foreign workers on the U.S. construction industry.

The research indicates that coastal states are a magnet for foreign-born Hardhats (who presumably are here legally due to the official, federal accumulation of the statistics). And it shows that Michigan, while it is technically 'coastal" because of its proximity to four of the five Great Lakes, is one of the lesser employers of foreign-born workers in the U.S. construction industry. The research was released

Dec. 1 by Construction Coverage, which provides guides, research, and insights on the industry. It issued its compilation based on numbers from U.S. Census Bureau and the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

"As a record construction boom collides with chronic labor shortages, the U.S. construction industry is more reliant on immigrant workers than ever," said Construction Coverage Founder and CEO Mike LaFirenza. "Nationwide, over a quarter of the construction workforce is foreignborn - and in several major metros, that figure exceeds 50%. As federal immigration enforcement ramps up, these markets in particular could see crews thin out, costs climb, and key projects delayed."

Under the category, "States where the construction industry depends most on foreign workers," the report said leading the pack are California, with 521,249 foreign-born construction industry employees, representing 41.5% of the state's total construction workforce. Texas (40.2%) follows

Building goods price hikes 'modest but persistent'

The producer price index for materials and services used in nonresidential construction rose 0.2 percent in September and 3.2 percent compared to September 2024, according to an analysis released Nov. 25 by the Associated General Contractors of America.

AGC officials said the latest figures – arriving late because of the government shutdown – "underscore how cost pressures

even as overall demand in several private-sector construction segments remains muted."

"Persistent input-price pressure, even when the increases are modest, creates a stop-and-go rhythm in procurement and production instead of a steady flow contractors and suppliers need." said Macrina Wilkins, the AGC's senior research analyst.

She noted that "these monthto-month swings make it harder

are resurfacing for contractors for firms to plan confidently and protect already-thin margins."

> Several major input categories saw notable year-over-year increases. The producer price index for aluminum mill shapes increased 1.7 percent last month and 26 percent from September 2024. While the index for steel mill products fell 1.5 percent in September, it climbed by 12.4 percent over the previous 12 months.

The index for precast concrete products inched up 0.3

percent for the month and 5.5 percent year-over-year. Diesel fuel, a critical input for off-road equipment and transportation, rose 1.8 percent for the month and 8.2 percent year over year.

Lumber and plywood, always a major goods category, rose just 1.4 percent year-over-year.

AGC officials said the September data showed that contractors are facing "modest but persistent" increases in input costs

U.P. pipe trades ready for bigger, better training space

ESCANABA – More room, with more efficient use of the space, is on the way for training the current and next generations of union plumbers, pipe fitters and HVAC mechanics in the Upper Peninsula. Plumbers and Pipe Fitters Local 111 is wrapping up construction of a new \$3 million, 12,096-square-foot training center. Work on the new facility began in April, and is expected to wrap up early next year.

Local 111 has union hall locations in Marquette and Escanaba, while its training operations have taken place in an existing facility next to the Escanaba hall at 2601 N. 30th St. This new training center is next door to and will supplement the existing 4,000-square-foot educational facility.

The new space is going to be a real benefit to the instructors the apprentices and other members," said Local 111 Training Coordinator John Antoncew. "It's going to greatly improve our ability to do hands-on training and support a growing apprenticeship program." Antoncew said nearly a third of the existing training center's educational space is taken up with equipment and materials, which are constantly being moved back and forth because of a lack of storage space. The existing training center, which was completed in 1998, will be retained, and get upgraded welding ventilation, added welding booths, as well as upgraded electrical and new paint.

Stop the tariff pendulum

At its core, construction represents an investment in and commitment to the future. Long before the first dirt is moved, a foundation is poured, or a building is framed and finished, someone must first make a decision, take a risk and commit resources based on a prediction that tomorrow's economy will pay off the effort years

I wrote in my July column that we were in the midst of a "pencil's down" moment due to project-killing economic uncertainty. Unfortunately, that moment is being prolonged by a series of bad decisions coming out of Washington, D.C. - decisions that will imperil future construction seasons and slow the economic growth working people depend on to build prosperous lives.

On-again, off-again tariffs do double damage by increasing costs and slowing economic growth. At the end of that road is nothing but paralysis and economic stagnation.

After all, we build wealth as a country and create opportunities for our people when we invest in the things that move society forward. The interstate highway system connected our vast country, facilitating movement and commerce. The space race drove technological innovation on multiple fronts. The internet connected us in new ways, democratizing entire industries. Public dollars kicked off each of these revolutions and facilitated trillions more in private investments, putting thousands of tradespeople to work on construction sites and spinning off countless jobs thereafter. None were red programs or blue projects; they just merely and powerfully represented American progress.



computers, plumbing and HVAC/R and industrial piping. The facility will also have hi-bay space for pipe rigging – and a classroom. "The new facility is going to have a dedicated classroom – we won't have to move things around and put things away just to have a class," Antoncew said.

Another feature of the new building: normally hidden behind walls, ceilings and in mechanical rooms, portions of the structure's mechanical systems and piping will be exposed as an architectural feature and as educational tools. Local 111's training facilities currently serve 57 apprentices, in addition

to providing space for journeyman upgrading. Roy Ness Contracting is acting as the project's general contractor, with electrical work done by Master Electric, plumbing and mechanical work by United Contractors Inc. and building HVAC/R controls by Johnson Controls. Other subcontractors have also contributed.







Building Michigan: Fort Wayne HISTORY IN THE MAKING



COMPLETED IN 1848, Fort Wayne in southwest Detroit is the last star-shaped fort in existence in the Midwest. It was built on 83 acres in a spot that's easily within cannon range of Canada across the Detroit River, but a political thaw with Great Britain in the 1840s meant that no cannon were placed at the fort. The star-shaped design was based on a 200-year-old fortification plan created by a French military engineer, which included elements that forced attackers to face a succession of obstacles and multiple angles of fire. By the 1830s and even into the early 1840s, the United States was still warily keeping an eye on any expansionist tendencies in the Northwest Territories by Great Britain and their Canadian commonwealth subjects.

The U.S. government came to realize that occupants of those territories, which included border states like Michigan and Minnesota, were woefully unprepared for any type of military incursion from the British.

No doubt, the U.S. defense planning would look like this: if Great Britain or any other European nation had belligerent designs on taking some North American tracts of land for their king or queen, wouldn't their attack start with a flotilla of warships sailing unmolested down the St. Lawrence River and into the Great Lakes?

That's the scenario the U.S. War Department was planning for as they were choosing a site for a new fort in 1840 to eliminate that soft underbelly along a strategic point on the banks of the Detroit River.

That site would become Fort Wavne – still intact and present today – a structure that became obsolete to its original purpose just about as soon as it opened. But while no hostile shots were ever fired from the fort, the 83-acre site would become host to a myriad of uses in the ensuing decades. Today, in a city that has seen dozens of historic downtown buildings become renovated in the past two decades, Fort Wayne on the city's southwest side stands as a tantalizingly unfinished project awaiting money and the political will to renovate what remains.

"In 1840, at the point on the Detroit River is closest to British Canada, the United States Army began surveying local farms for the placement of a new artillery post," says the Historic Fort Wayne Coalition. "A five-point star fort was slated to have the most up-todate cannon capable of firing on enemy sailing vessels and the Canadian shore. It would be named for General Anthony Wayne, whose defeat of the British at Fallen Timbers in 1796 resulted in United States occupation of the Northwest Territories.

"This new fort would be Detroit's third, yet its first to be built by Americans."

The establishment of the military installation at Fort Wayne was authorized by an act of Congress on Aug. 4, 1841, "as the result of a national defense plan to ensure protection for the Northwest. The possibility of attack from British North America favored the strategic location at a major bend in the Detroit River," according to the Historic Fort Wayne Master Plan prepared in 2003 by The Smith Group architects.

Construction of the fort at the foot of Livernois Avenue and the Detroit River would take place between 1842-1851. The fort was the first major work designed and built by Army Engineer and West Point graduate Lt. Montgomery C. Meigs, who later became the indispensable Quartermaster General of the entire Union Army during the Civil War.

"The original portion of the fort – a square, four-bastioned work with oak log revetments (a retaining wall or the fort's facing), and a brick and limestone postern (a secondary door or gate) and sally port (a secured entrance) was built between 1844 and 1847 at a cost of \$150,000," said The Smith Group. "Construction of the Old Barracks commenced in 1845, and was completed in 1848. In 1863 the original oak revetments were replaced by a brick masonry scarp (a steep embankment), incorporating the 1845 postern and sally port, thus completing the Star Fort essentially as we see it today. The Star Fort and the Old Barracks are the oldest buildings that survive today on the site.'

It was a strong, modern fort, but the big guns never made it to Fort Wayne. "Diplomacy intervened, however, in the mission of Fort Wayne," said American Heritage Magazine's short history on Fort Wayne. "Before any cannon were even procured for the new fort, the United States signed a treaty with Britain that called for diplomatic solutions to their territorial disputes. The new fort was re-commissioned as an infantry garrison, but did not see any troops until the outbreak of the Civil War, when the first Michigan soldiers reported for duty."

Said the Historic Fort Wayne Coalition: "Because of the new relationship with Britain, and later Canada, Fort Wayne never saw a shot fired in anger. Instead, the peaceful location became a primary induction center for Michigan troops entering battle in every

U. S. conflict from the Civil War to Vietnam."

The coalition said among other duties over the course of its 125 years, Fort Wayne has served as an infantry training station, and the primary procurement location for vehicles and weapons manufactured in Detroit during both world wars. During World War II, it also housed prisoners of war from Italy. Thousands of soldiers swore oaths of allegiance and were given physicals there during the Vietnam and Korean wars. Additionally, following Detroit's 1967 riots, the fort became a haven for many families whose homes were burned, with many residing there until as late as 1971.

Beginning in 1948, the coalition said the fort was slowly turned over to the City of Detroit, parcel by parcel. Over the next 28 years, the city eventually came to own the entire property, with the exception of nine acres still occupied by the Army Corps of Engineers. The property is now under the care of the City of Detroit Recreation Department, along with the assistance of its volunteer

Beyond efforts to stabilize the existing structures, progress to make Fort Wayne a prime historic destination has been agonizingly slow over the decades. The Historic Fort Wayne Master Plan from 2020 by the City of Detroit General Services Department said it "began a comprehensive strategic planning process" for the fort after an agreement was made with the federal government for the site's future, but there have been no announcements of arrangements with public nor private partners to make significant improvements.

Fort Wayne has nearly 40 historic structures at the site, as well as a quarter mile of riverfront access. Unfortunately, many of those structure are in

Historic Fort Wayne is open to visitors during the warmer months. Visitors can tour the original 1848 limestone barracks building, 1845 star fort structure renovated in 1861, the restored Commanding Officers house, and the Spanish-American War guard house.



One quarter of U.S. trades workers are foreign-born but not so much in Mich.

with 491,132 foreign-born workers, while New Jersey (38.7%), Florida (37.9%), and New York (37.1%) round out the top five.

While 26% of U.S. construction industry employment is foreignborn, this immigrant dependence is not distributed equally," Construction Coverage said. "Foreign-born workers make up a substantial share of the construction workforce along the West Coast, the Southwest, and the Northeast."

Accordingly, the states with the lowest percentage of foreign-born construction workers include No. 50 Montana (2.9%), Maine (3.1%), Vermont (3.2%), West Virginia (3.4%) and North Dakota (3.4%). Michigan (8.3%) was No. 35 on the list among the states.

The study dove down even further, looking at city/regions. The Miami area led the nation with 66.2 percent foreign-born construction workers. The areas around Los Angeles, Washington, D.C. and Houston followed, all topping 51 percent foreign-born workers. Well down on the list is the Detroit area (13.0 percent), which came in No. 46 among big cities/metro regions – that percentage is ninth-lowest among big cities in the U.S.

"These patterns reflect the geographic clustering of immigrant populations, the scale of urban construction activity, and the deep integration of foreign-born labor into local building trades," the study said.

Among Michigan's "mid-sized metros," the Grand Rapids area (10.6%) came in at No. 62 on the national list, followed by Kalamazoo (6.1%, No. 72) and Lansing (5.2%, No. 78).

The study said nationally, construction occupation groups that are most reliant on foreign labor include: drywall and ceiling installers (56.9%), painters and paperhangers (50.2%), and roofers (50.0%) Other such trades include flooring and tile installers (46.7%) and construction laborers (42.4%).

Trades in the U.S. that are least reliant on foreign workers include HVAC installers, sheet metal workers and plumbers and pipe fitters, which are all clustered at about 18 percent.



They noted that this imbalance, where materials costs edge higher while final demand and pricing power soften, "is adding pressure for firms at a time when several private sector markets remain uneven. Uncertainty around future tariff levels and global trade conditions is adding another layer of caution, making it harder for contractors to plan procurement or secure long-term pricing with confidence," the

"Contractors can manage modest cost increases, but they need a predictable environment to keep projects moving," said Jeffrey D. Shoaf, the chief executive officer of the Associated General Contractors of America. "Greater clarity on tariff policy and progress on outstanding trade issues would help stabilize materials markets and give firms more confidence to plan for the work ahead.





At least ten days prior to the nomination meeting, notice shall be mailed to the last known address of all members in good standing of the Local Union setting forth (1) the date and place of the nomination meeting, and stating that the delegates to a convention will be nominated at the meeting: (2) the notice shall also state the date, time, and place of secret ballot election of delegates to the convention; and (3) The notice should state also that in the event of a tie and a runoff election is necessary, then the date, time, and place of the runoff shall be so

Protests of an election of delegates to the United Association Convention shall be processed under the provisions of Section 125 of this Constitution.

UA Sec 16: The candidate or candidates receiving the highest numbers of votes in the delegate election shall be declared the elected delegate or delegates. The candidates receiving the next highest votes shall be alternates, by descending numerical order, and shall act is case of the inability of any regular delegate to attend the convention.

UA Sec 17: No member shall be eligible as a delegate or alternate unless he shall have been a good standing member of the Local Union which he is to represent for at least two continuous years previous to his election and he remains in good standing from the date of his election through the period of the convention.

UA Sec 18: The duties of weekly salaried elected officers of Local Unions shall also include serving a delegate to the United Association convention for his Local Union.

Note: The interpretation of this section shall not mean that all weekly salaried elected officers are automatically delegated to the United Association Convention if the number of weekly salaried elected officers in a given Local Union exceed the number of Delegates the Local Union is entitled to. As defined in Section 12.

UA Sec 19: The Recording Secretary of each Local Union shall, after the election of a delegate or delegates, immediately forward the to General Secretary-Treasurer upon the official credential form and names, card numbers, and addresses of the members elected, and the General Secretary-Treasurer shall submit same to the Credentials Committee of the United Association.



New Projects: Members are urged to report the start of any/all new projects to the Local Union. Members working for a contractor who may be looking to hire additional laborers are urged to call the Union Hall and help a brother or sister get referred out to work. The next time, it may be your name on the list when that call comes in for work.

Referral List: Every member who is looking for work must call or come to the Local Union Office on Mondays between 1:00 pm and 4:00 pm to put their name on the Out-of-Work list. You must have an Out-of-Work skills sheet filled out and on file in order to be referred out for work by the Local Union. FYI: It is the Member's responsibility to regularly notify the Local Union of any changes to his/her skillsets. It could mean the difference of being sent to work or not!

Roll Call: All members on the out-of-work list must re-register every quarter within the first five days of the following months: March, June, September and December. Your failure to do so will result in your name being removed from the referral list. *Example: If your name is on the list in April and/or May and you don't reregister by June 5 your name will be removed from the list.





You and your health . . .



WHEN YOU TRY TO SORT through who's responsible for rising U.S. healthcare costs, it can feel like a room full of kids shouting, "I didn't do it!" Every party declares they are not responsible, and that they must charge more because of their higher costs. Here

are a few examples: Hospitals and physician practices argue for higher rates to cover their rising costs, including advanced technologies which treat illnesses and disease previously untreatable or treated with less success; and high rates of uncompensated care.

Insurance companies must pay for higher priced services that include new approaches and technologies to manage chronic disease, complex cancer care and specialty prescription drugs to treat them.

Employer-sponsored plans, Taft-Hartley funds, and government plans are hit with the same rising costs - and much (or a portion) of that burden gets shifted onto workers through higher premium contributions, larger copays, and steeper deductibles.

What They Have In Common

Rising prices are the common denominator among all the parties in healthcare. So what's driving

Some costs actually reflect progress. New therapies and cutting-edge drugs can be expensive to develop and deliver, but they often transform care in ways that were unimaginable even a decade ago. Today, gene therapies can cure certain inherited diseases that once meant a lifetime of hospitalizations, and new cancer immunotherapies help patients live longer, healthier lives with fewer side effects than traditional treatments.

These innovations come with a price tag, but they also bring enormous value-offering better outcomes, less suffering, and sometimes, genuine cures.

The Healthcare Blame Game: Everyone Denies It. You Pay For It.

Some of the very entities complaining about higher costs are making the problem worse. Big insurers, hospitals, and physician practices have all sought to gobble up other healthcare companies. The result is not for the better.

But then there are cost drivers that actually threaten the longterm sustainability of healthcare - and it turns out some of the very entities complaining about higher costs are making the problem worse. The topic of consolidations in healthcare might sound boring, but it has real world impacts on how our healthcare system works, and it's not for the better.

Making Matters Worse

Every type of big healthcare entity - insurers, hospitals, and physician practices - has sought to get even bigger in recent years by gobbling up as many healthcare companies as possible. While some argue that consolidation in the healthcare industry creates efficiencies that can improve healthcare, unfortunately there are many examples to the contrary:

- · A doctor office visit in a facility affiliated with a hospital system may now incur a "facility fee" in addition to the doctor charges. And charges for specific procedures such as infusions performed in hospital-affiliated facilities can be billed at higher rates than in those not affiliated with a hospital system.
- Maternity services in some rural areas can now only be accessed by driving long distances to a provider when before there were local resources for this type of care. As smaller systems are bought by larger ones, consolidating service is more profitable, even though it results in maternity care deserts.
- Medicare spending on colonoscopies increased by an average of \$3,851 per year from 2012

through 2015 when gastroenterologists consolidated with a hospital, according to a study cited in a 2025 U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO) report.

In at least 35 states, three or fewer insurance companies control 80 percent or more of the market. Medicare Advantage markets are similarly dominated by just one or two carriers, especially in rural areas. Another U.S. GAO report published in 2024 cites strong evidence that this type of concentration is associated with higher consumer premiums.

Stop! I Want to Get Off!!

How do we stop this madness? Health spending in the U.S. was \$74 billion in 1970. By 2000 it had gone up to \$1.4 trillion. In 2024 healthcare spending was \$5.2 trillion. A survey of employers done by the business analysis firm Mercer indicates employers expect their healthcare benefit costs to increase 6.7 percent in 2026, so there is no anticipation of a slowdown in costs.

The Will To Make Change

Our collective will to make change in healthcare should start with the moral fortitude to assure economic resources are available for the well-being of all. Stopping anti-competitive consolidations would be one place to start.
